









# What Opportunities Exist to Earn College Credit or Certifications While in High School?



## What is In-School Dual Enrollment?

- The opportunity to earn both high school <u>and</u> college credit at no personal cost at each high school campus.
- College classes offered by Hampton City Schools in partnership with Thomas Nelson Community at all four area high schools.
- Qualified high school faculty teach TNCC courses in the high school during the regular school day.



# What is the Difference Between Dual Enrollment (DE) and Advanced Placement (AP)?

- To earn college credit for AP, a student must take a national AP exam at the end of the year and score as required by the college or university.
- Dual enrollment credit is based on daily performance and testing conducted in the classroom throughout the semester.
- A student must earn a "C" or higher to transfer college credit.
- Dual enrollment credits create an official college transcript that can be sent to your institution of choice.

# What are the Benefits of Dual Enrollment?

- Students receive first-hand exposure to the rigor of college-level work.
- Students enjoy access to all TNCC library and campus resources.
- If a student earns a grade of "C" or better, credit transfers to most Virginia colleges and universities.
- Less time required after high school to finish a college degree.
- Saves students and families money on tuition.

### Early College Scholars Seal

#### ... Another benefit of Dual Enrollment...

To qualify for the Early College Scholars program, a student must:

- Have a "B" average or better;
- Be pursuing an Advanced Studies Diploma; and
- Take and complete college-level course work (i.e., Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, Cambridge, or dual enrollment) that will earn at least 15 transferable college credits.

### Who is Eligible for Dual Enrollment?

- Students must be a high school junior or senior.
- Students must meet admissions criteria and prerequisites established by Thomas Nelson Community College and Hampton City Schools.
- Students must have parental permission to register for dual enrollment courses.

# What is the process for In-School Dual Enrollment?



- Complete "Opt-in" request form on school website.
- Apply to TNCC by visiting <u>www.tncc.edu/apply</u>. A TNCC Student ID number will be required for course registration.
- 3. Provide SAT, ACT, PSAT and Math SOL scores.
- 4. Upon approval, sign and complete registration forms.

The College and Career Coach will share approvals with counselors for schedule changes and updates.

### Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

- Are textbooks included for Dual Enrollment?
  - Yes. Textbooks and tuition are paid for by HCS.
- Do all of the classes count toward high school graduation?
  - Yes. Please speak with your school counselor to review your academic plan.
- Can I take DE courses regardless of my academy?
  - With the exception of the IB Program, all academies give students an opportunity to take dual enrollment courses.
- How are the Dual Enrollment courses weighted?
  - Courses are weighted the same as AP.
