ALEXIS ARMOUR...

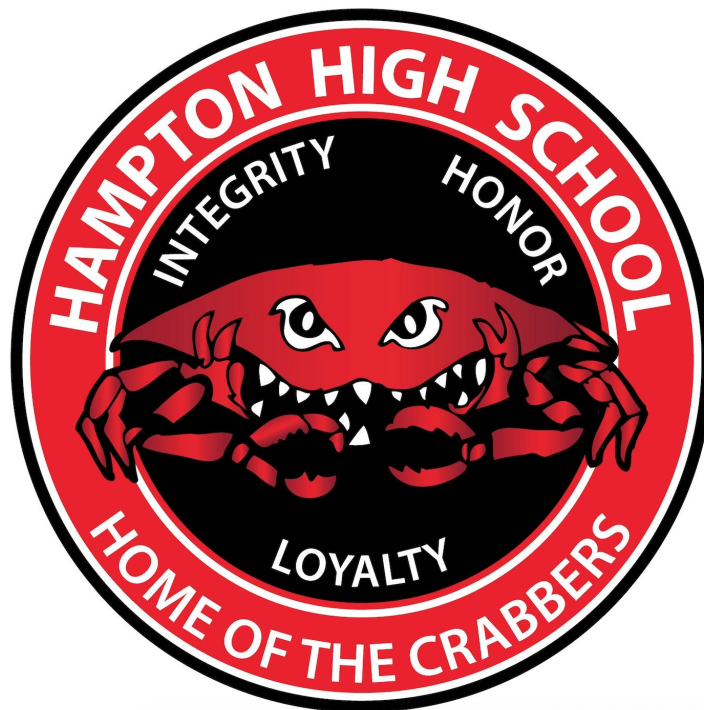
