

Return-to-School Checklist

EVERY CHILD, EVERY DAY, WHATEVER IT TAKES!

Has Required Immunizations/Physical

- □ Has all required immunizations for entry into grade level (DPT, Polio, Hep A, Hep B, MMR, Varicella). Seventh (7th) graders must have Tdap and Meningococcal #1. Twelfth (12th) graders must have Meningococcal #2 (unless they have received the first Meningococcal after the age of 16, then they do not need the second one). Kindergartners must have Hep A.
- □ New students must have a current physical if they are in K-5.

Access Educational Technology

- □ Create a **Parent Portal** account (if new to the division or you have not created one in the past) to view student grades and attendance
 - http://www.hampton.k12.va.us/parent/parentportal/parentportal.html
- □ Activate your **ParentSquare** account (if new to the division or you have not activated your account in the past) to receive division and school communication and alerts https://www.parentsquare.com/signin
 - Parents/Guardians who do not have an activated account will receive an activation request via email or text on a weekly basis through mid-September.
- □ Check your child's Chromebook and charger (if they have one at home). Is it

- broken in any way? Does it charge? Have your child report any issues to school staff once school begins so that the Chromebook or charger can be repaired or exchanged.
- □ Need Internet Access? You may be eligible for a mifi Internet hotspot for your child's use at home. Check with your school's office for an application.

Submit Parent Forms

- □ HCS Students' Rights and Responsibilities Handbook Review Confirmation - SBO 152 -REQUIRED EACH YEAR
- □ Student Directory Information Form SBO 55 (via Parent Portal) REQUIRED ONLY ONCE; if SBO 55 has been completed in a previous school year, it only needs to be completed if a parent/guardian wants to update information.

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Attendance

Regular attendance is essential to every student's academic, social, emotional, and behavioral growth. Students whose parents actively support regular attendance in school help ensure that their children have more opportunities to learn and develop important social-emotional skills. These opportunities help prepare all students to reach their full potential to graduate college, career, and life ready.



Parents/Guardians should contact their child's school whenever their student is absent and when they have questions about their child's attendance record. Parents may also contact the Office of Student Services (757) 727-2135 for questions about division attendance or truancy procedures and policies.

Students' Rights & Responsibilities Handbook

The Hampton City Schools Students' Rights & Responsibilities Handbook contains important information for students and families (e.g., school calendar, academic information, attendance information, code of student conduct). The handbook is available on the HCS website. Additionally, all parents/guardians will receive a link to the handbook via ParentSquare. Please review the handbook and the code of student conduct with your student to ensure he/she is prepared for the new school year. The Documentation of the Rights and Responsibilities Handbook Review must be completed. Further directions regarding the completion of this form will be provided on the first day of school. Families who would like a hard copy of the handbook may contact their child's school for assistance.

School Meals

All HCS students will receive breakfast and lunch at no cost. Breakfast and lunch will be provided at all HCS schools. Snacks and a la carte items will be available for purchase using your student's meal account, which can be funded through MyPaymentsPlus by visiting www.mypaymentsplus.com or downloading the app. No cash, checks, money orders, or credit card payments will be taken for snack or a la carte purchases at the schools.

Student Safety

Student welfare and wellness remain a top priority for the school division. Students, staff, parents, and community members are encouraged to report concerns about bullying/cyberbullying or harassment to their school principals immediately. You may report incidents using the division's **Temporary SAFE School Hotline at 757-727-2255 (CALL)**. Additional information regarding a new safe school hotline will be provided at a later date. School counselors are also a good resource for students and parents and can provide support for a child's social-emotional wellbeing. Counselors may be reached by email or phone or by contacting the student's school.
